WHY THIS? WHY NOW? CURRICULUM SEQUENCING AND ASSESSMENT

This unit builds on previously delivered media units such as Photo Editing and Audio Editing (both in Year 4). It puts the concepts of hardware inputs and outputs into practical context, while adding relevant knowledge towards competent and creative video editing.

This unit will prepare children for video and audio production requirements across the curriculum, including into Year 6 and secondary education.

Curriculum milestones (above) can be assessed throughout, and you may find that using a Digital Floor Book provides a useful way to document progress as well as store completed work. This unit gives learners the opportunity to learn how to create short videos in groups. As they progress, they will be exposed to topicbased language and develop the skills of capturing, editing, and manipulating video. Active learning is encouraged through guided questions and by working in small groups to investigate the use of devices and software. Learners are guided with step-by-step support to take their idea from conception to completion.

The use of green screen is incorporated into this unit as an extra possibility, giving an opportunity for learners to use cross curricular knowledge (history lends itself well) and giving a purpose for the main video project (e.g. a news bulletin with studio and outside report segments).

At the conclusion of the unit, learners have the opportunity to reflect on and assess their progress in creating a video.

This could be run over 3-4 hour long lessons or two afternoons.

Resources required: Screen sharing software, for the teacher to show what is on the iPad screen via the class board Storyboard handout per child iPads iMovie app Do Ink app (if tackling Green Screening)
